

Newsletter December 2020

The month of November is supposedly beginning of cold in North India as the Sunrays fall quite obliquely on the ground. But Shiksha Sopan volunteers never go in cold mode. A landmark activity in November was the election of the new Executive Committee by our General Body which was overdue. November is also a month of festivals. The whole Nation celebrates Deepotsava with great enthusiasm and Shiksha Sopan did it in its own way. Children's day is another great day making November special. All our centers actively contributed in education and social character building while following the guidelines of Covid 19 given by the Govt. of India.

Formation of New Executive Committee

Executive Committee (EC) is the highest policy making body of Shiksha Sopan which takes all the major decisions for impactful functioning of the organization. The tenure of the Present EC got over in March 2020 but due to Pandemic it was extended for 9 months. As per our convention, the outgoing EC deliberates on the possible names for the key positions in EC, namely the President, the Secretary and the Treasurer and proposes these names to the GBM for discussion and final decision and the same was followed. A General Body Meeting was convened on 7th November over Zoom, with the major agenda of electing the next EC. A total of 32 members joined the meeting.

Shree Atul Verma, Secretary Shiksha Sopan welcomed all GBM Members and requested Shree Ranjan Upadhyay to conduct the meeting. To begin with an overview of the major activities and achievements of Shiksha Sopan in the tenure of the present EC was presented before the GBM. All members appreciated the excellent work by this EC, especially in the pandemic period. The President Dr Sameer Khandekar shared his experience of this tenure and gave meaningful messages.

Various names were suggested for the new EC and the GBM unanimously elected the members and decided on their roles in the EC. The key office bearers elected were Dr. Arun Kumar Sharma (President), Dr. Sameer Khandekar (Treasurer) and Mr. Amit Kumar Bajpai (Secretary). Representation was ensured from IITK Faculty, Students and our volunteers at different centers.

All members of the GBM were very happy to participate in this important meeting and thanked the outgoing EC for its good work. Everyone wished the new EC for upcoming strides of Shiksha Sopan. and wished the new EC for the upcoming tenure. Dr Arun K Sharma addressed the GBM as the new President and assured his involvement and contribution while thanking the GBM to have confidence in him.

SGPV Prakalp for Assisting Higher Education

As mentioned in our October Newsletter, Shiksha Sopan has launched "**Shree Ganesh Prasad Verma Uchch Shiksha Prakalp**" to financially support children going for higher education (beyond Std 12). The Prakalp committee headed by Dr Arun Kumar Sharma, now our President, with Mr Amit Kumar Bajpai and Mr Atul Verma as members, has formulated the norms and has designed an Application form to facilitate decision making. We got 6 applications in the month of November 2020 for such a support. They were all interviewed by the committee and the recommended amount was given to these students. Out of these, 3 are for B Tech (Ritik from Railways university, Udit from MAKAUT and Vikash from NIT Jamshedpur), one for MBA (Himanshu from PSIT Kanpur), one for BSc (Vinay from CSJM Univ Kanpur) and one for Polytechnic (Mano from Govt Polytechnic College Kanpur). Himanshu is our new EC member and very committed Sopan volunteer, Vinay is associated with Sopan Ashram, Mano had been our SASK student and Ritik had been an active worker at Sopan Library. Udit and Vikash are not directly associated with Shiksha Sopan but were recommended by our senior volunteers. Shiksha Sopan wishes all the them a very good career. A total of Rs 3,00,540 were given to these students.

Prize Distribution Function of Fancy Dress Competition

As mentioned in the previous newsletter a Fancy Dress Competition was organized by Shiksha Sopan in which all centers participated and we got hundreds of video entries. After screening and 2nd round of evaluation, the prize winners were announced from the three groups, std 1-5, std 6-8 and std 9-12. Apart from first, second and third there were some special prizes. All this was in electronic mode but we decided to hold the prize distribution function physically at Sopan Ashram and it was done on 10th November.

It was a very happy day for all of them. After a long time the students from all the centers of Shiksha Sopan, and the center coordinators got a chance to meet each other and talk face to face. Videos of all selected students were shown one by one. It also gave all students to see each other's performance for the first time in this whole competition. Each video was a gem and lots of applaud was echoed from everyone. All the center coordinators were asked to share their experiences on how they inspired the children to participate in the program, how they convinced that they can make videos of their performance at home and share them to the central coordinator electronically.

Together with the prizes to the students, each center coordinator was given a gift from Shiksha Sopan for the marvelous work they had done in conducting Digital Fancy Dress Competition.



<u>COmmunity Computer Instruction LAB (कोकिला)</u>

Shiksha Sopan is working towards setting up a Computer Instruction Lab for the community and especially for students. This will also be used for Computer-interfaced Science Experiments which are widely used if institutions of high reputation.



In the month of November we worked towards making the necessary infrastructure including a set of 10 computer tables being constructed which will be put up in one of the halls at Sopan Ashram. We hope to make the lab functional by January. The initial grant for purchasing the computer systems has already been received from Pragati Foundation before the lockdown started.

Sopan Anaupacharik Shikshan Kendra (SASK)

As new cases of COVID 19 are still coming in significant numbers, in November too the center was not open for students. They were helped in different ways keeping the covid-norms in mind. The volunteers visited the center regularly for making the teaching module for children. The program was running in a physical model as well as digital mode. The physical Community classes were held with the same precautions that were decided in previous months. Some of the functions too were held there.

C V Raman Jayanti

In our atmosphere, Science is everywhere and our scientists have played a great role in shaping our understanding of Nature and in turn making the lives more productive. who did well in the field of science. A greatly respected name in this series is Dr. C V Raman, the first Indian scientist who got the Nobel

Prize for his discoveries in the field of "Light Scattering". Dr. Raman was born on 7th Nov 1888 in Chennai (former Madras). SASK celebrated his B'day and remembered his contribution to the Physics field. Children of SASK made science projects like a solar system, parts of bulb, oxygen making in a lab, etc. Miss Seema Verma delivered an interesting story about Dr. Raman. All was done in the open space of community class.

Rangoli Competition

To keep the spirits of students high in these psychologically difficult days, SASK organized a Rangoli competition in the Community class. This competition was conducted by Shubendra ji who is a Ph.D. student of IITK. Each participant was assigned a space keeping social distancing in mind to make the Rangoli. They made wonderful Rangolies with great passion.



Shubendra ji motivated and applauded the participants of this competition and selected Rangolies for some prizes although every participant made good Rangoli. In this competition Sonam of class 6th got 1st prize, Mansi and Muskan of class 4th got 2nd prize and Ajit of class 6th and Gaurav of class 8th got third prize.
