### Kanpur Zoo Visit

Visit to Kanpur zoo was an interesting experience for the children of SASK. They went to zoo by bus with teachers on 06<sup>th</sup> February, 2016 (Saturday). Kanpur zoo is near Nawabganj. Ms Seema Verma, Principal, SASK took care of whole visit. Some of IITK NSS students Mr. Lokesh, Mr. Saumydeep, Mr. Pawan, Mr. Mithil and SASK teachers Ms Suneeta, Ms Deepti and Ms Nisha were also present there. These volunteers bought the tickets and all students with these volunteers entered the gate. There were ponds on both the sides of the road. Ducks were swimming in the ponds.



They saw elephants, stags and 'Neelgai' etc. Then they came to the cages of birds. There were different kinds of birds. Peacocks were in large numbers. Then they saw tigers in their enclosures. They also saw White Asian tigers, cheetah, leopard, jaguar, hyena, black bear, grizzly bear, rhinoceros, hippopotamus, monkeys, Musk deer and deer,. ### Workshop at NASI, Allahabad

Shiksha Sopan members are making efforts teaching for spreading its effective methodology for science education. With examples from daily life situations these concepts were made more familiar to them. The most attractive part of this workshop was variation of buoyancy as an object is taken deeper in water. The fact that it does not depend on depth was surprising for almost all. It was also like a puzzle and when they understood the concept, it was a lovely experience.

They also talked about the methodology of science teaching among all the teachers and this teaching methodology was appreciated by the teachers. Dr Santosh Kumar from NASI managed the whole program.
