Scientific visits of schools

The Shiksha Sopan team was busy in October, organizing various programs, including scientific tour of Sopan Ashram by different schools. Students and teachers had a great experience visiting and learning from Sopan Ashram, which motivates them to come again and again. The Sopan team has created experiments related to various topics, making even complex physics concepts appear simple and easy. Students see those experiments, touch them, discuss them and then even try them out. It is these experiments that make Sopan Ashram lively and energetic.

Six schools from Kanpur and other districts visited Sopan Ashram in October 2025. Dr. H. C. Verma sir was present in 3 visits, interacted with the students and their teachers, motivated them to try to produce minimum carbon dioxide, the earth is getting sick and it is everyone's duty to take care of it, also motivated the students on AI to use it as an assistant and not to become completely dependent on it. Shiksha Sopan team members presented incredible, attractive experiments, discussing science and showcasing the labs of Sopan Ashram. They also demonstrated outdoor experiments set up throughout the entire premises of Sopan Ashram.

First Sunday Club (FSC)

In October, FSC was held on 12th October 2025 at Sopan Ashram, Nankari, Kanpur. 29 teachers attended the session. Mr. Ramendra Kushwaha, a dedicated member of FSC from Auraiya came with four bottles and demonstrated the density, law of flotations discussed etc. Everyone these topics extensively, and Verma sir was present to clear the doubts which came in discussions.



Teachers came with doubts to share in the FSC group, everyone discussed them. After that, Verma sir gave final answers of the questions.

We invited, Mr. Manish Singh Rathor, a very dedicated teacher, to FSC. He prepared how to use mobile as a meter for experiments. He demonstrated several simple experiments, one of which was particularly attractive, involving two phones, you can measure the velocity of sound. Everyone was happy and thanked to Mr. Manish. We again requested him to come for a long workshop. Dr. H. C. Verma sir, presented a small memento and Shawal to him.

Teachers and Students Interaction Sessions

In October, Shiksha Sopan team was invited to interact with teachers and students from different places. On 25th October, Dr. H. C. Verma and Mr. Amit Kumar Bajpai visited Saraswati Vidya Mandir, Fathehpur to interact with students. Around 400 students from over 35 districts were in attendance. Verma sir motivated them and answers their quires.

On 27th October, DAV, NUPPL, Hamirpur organized one teacher's experimental workshop in collaboration with SGM-IAPT Anveshika and Shiksha Sopan. Around 44 teachers from different schools were present. Dr. H. C. Verma, Mr. Amit Kumar Bajpai and Mr. Himanshu demonstrated simple experiments that they will use in their classroom during their teaching. Workshop conducted successfully.

On 30th October, Opportunity School organized a Science workshop Vigyan Vithika. They were invited to conduct one science shows for the students and teachers. Mr. Amit K Bajpai, Mr. Yogesh Kumar Jha, Mr. Vinay Kumar Mishra demonstrated wonderful experiments.

The birth anniversaries of Mahatma Gandhi ji and Lal Bahadur Shastri ji were celebrated with great enthusiasm at the SASK. The festival of Vijayadashami was also celebrated on the same day. The student beautifully decorated the entire campus on this occasion. Since both festivals coincided, the student artistically depicted the victory of good over evil by representing Goddess Durga's triumph and Lord Rama's bow striking down the ten-headed Ravana, the symbol of evil. Through these presentations, they conveyed the message of truth's victory over falsehood.

The program began with Ms. Seema Verma's welcoming the guests and extending greetings on the occasion of Vijayadashami and the birth anniversaries of Gandhi Ji and Shastri Ji. The chief guests — Dr. Neeraj Mohan Chawake, Shruti Mam, and Mr. Amit K Bajpai — garlanded the portraits of Mahatma Gandhi ji and Lal Bahadur Shastri ji. PhD students from the Material Advantage Group — Ayushi ji, Shruti ji, Bhumika ji, and Simran Ji — offered floral tributes to the portraits of these great personalities.







On this occasion, Rani of Class 6th performed a beautiful hymn, "Raghupati Raghav Raja Ram," while Avantika of Class 7th presented a song dedicated to Lal Bahadur Shastri Ji, highlighting his ideals and noble qualities.

Rani of Class 6th anchored the entire program gracefully. The chief guest and other guests blessed and motivated the student with their encouraging words. As in previous years, all the student were gifted stationery items by Shiksha Sopan, which made them very happy. PhD students from the Material Advantage Group also distributed school bags to the student, adding to their joy. The celebration concluded expressing gratitude to the chief guest and other guests by Seema ji and presenting the handmade gifts created by the student to them.

Craft Activity

In the craft activity, Ms Seema Verma taught the student how to make beautiful diya holders. The diya holders were crafted using waste bangles, cards, pearl rubber sheets, and fabric colors. The student created various designs such as Jharokha-style candle holders, diya wall hangings, diya dholaks, Tulsi diyas, and lotus diya holders. All the diya holders made by the student were very attractive. These handmade creations were prepared as gifts for the well-wishers of Shiksha Sopan on the occasion of Diwali.



Academic Activity

In the academic activities, several engaging sessions were organized for the student. In mathematics, Seema ji taught the concepts of Least Common Factor (LCF) and Highest Common Factor (HCF), along with addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, and the conversion of decimal numbers into fractions and vice versa.



Students of Classes 7 and 8 were taught factorization and introduced to the concept of the opposite sides of a right-angled triangle. These topics were explained through mathematical models, making learning interactive and easy to understand. In English, the student were encouraged to read English storybooks, newspapers, comics, and other materials to improve their reading and comprehension skills.

In science, students from Classes 6 to 8 learned about the process of nutrition in animals through pictures and videos. They also performed activities related to the conditions necessary for photosynthesis.

Sunita Maurya ji explained the story of human evolution and held discussions based on related questions and answers. She also provided information about the formation and functions of the Gram Panchayat, Kshetra Panchayat, and Zila Panchayat. Additionally, she explained aspects of rural lifestyle and agriculture. The student were also given information about the life and achievements of great personalities such as Goswami Tulsidas and Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj.



Diwali celebration

Diwali was celebrated on 18th October at the SASK with great enthusiasm. The student decorated the center beautifully using colored A4 papers. On this occasion, Rani of Class 6 narrated the story of the Ramayana to all the student, while Avantika of Class 7 sang a melodious song, "Ram Ghar Aayenge To Angna Sajaayenge."

Seema ji explained to the student that Diwali is the festival of lights, symbolizing the dispelling of darkness both within and around us. Lamps were gifted to all the student on behalf of Shiksha Sopan. The student also packed and sent the lamps and diya holders—handmade by the students of the SASK—to the well-wishers of Shiksha Sopan. Seema Verma also advised the student to be careful while bursting firecrackers.
